Education Reimbursement

Don't forget to take advantage of Beacon's Education Reimbursement benefit. Details of that benefit as a refresher...

Beacon Technologies, Inc will reimburse employees up to \$2,500 per year for education related to their job at Beacon.All education and training requests must be preapproved. It is the employee's responsibility to obtain the appropriate signatures on the form. Employees will also be required to show proof of completion before payment will be processed. 3 - After completion of the course provide Jean Burke with proof of completion, expense report, and receipts.
